THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



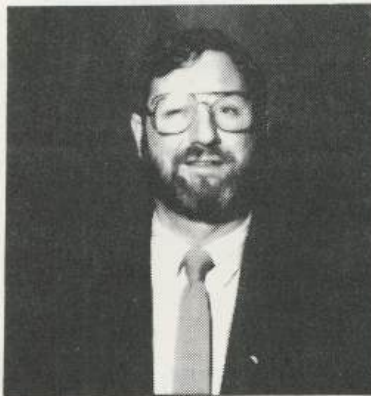

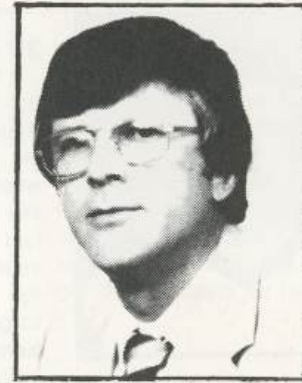
A MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR

DIRECTORATE CHAIRMAN

I am pleased at this opportunity to wish the Western Lacrosse Association the best of luck in achieving a great year in lacrosse in 1986. Let me also thank you, the fan and supporter, for being in attendance and buying this program.

The very high momentum and excellent lacrosse that was displayed in 1985, and particularly the national championships, has brought a wave of optimism and excitement into the 1986 lacrosse season. I have attended meetings of just about every senior league during the off season and am very pleased at the feeling of optimism, energy and pre-planning that has occurred since last November. 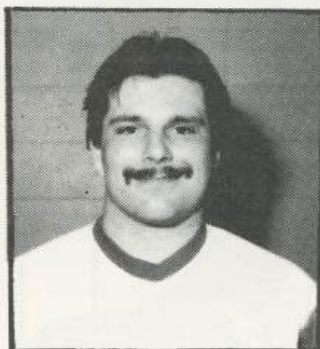

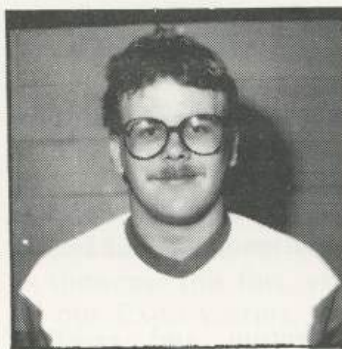

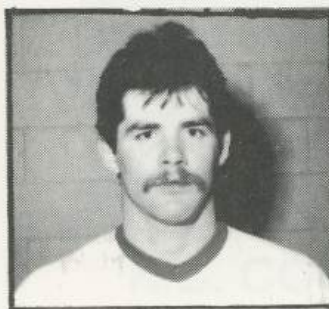
2 - Ross Angelucci

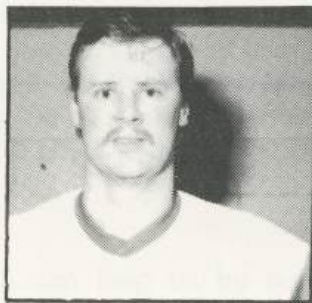
3 - Scott Leibling

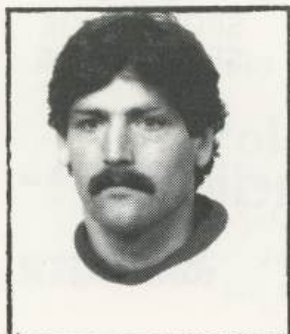
5 - Geordie Dean

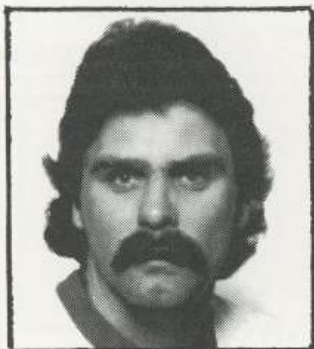
8 - Steve Manning

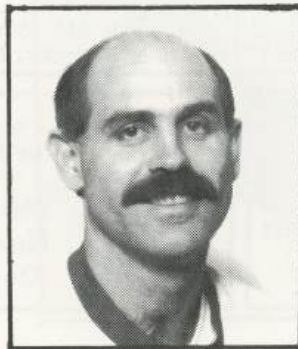
6 - Eric Cowieson

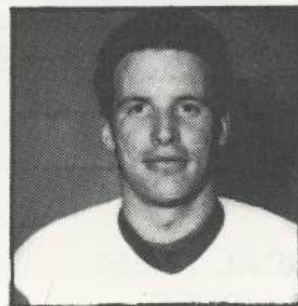
10 - Dave Durante

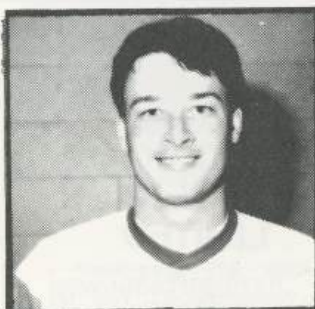
11 - Ben Heiltjes

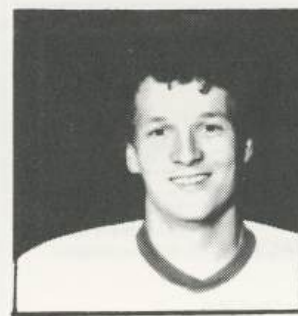
14 - Jim Lightbody

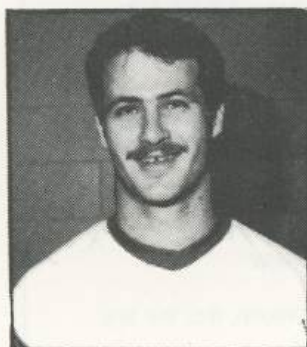
15 - Bob Johnston

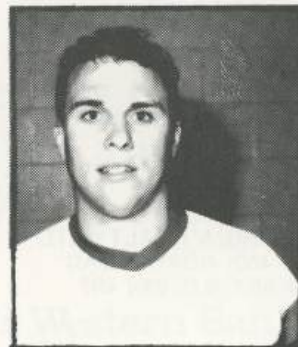
17 - Andy Shaughnessy

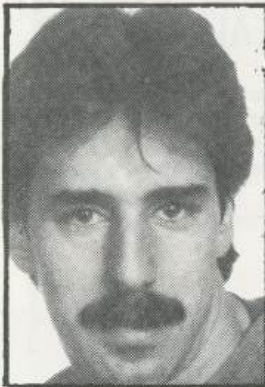
21 - Jim Vilneff

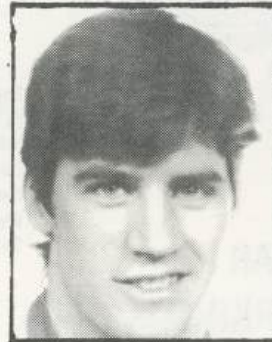
22 - Brian Baker

Brian comes to the Sr. team as a rookie but he has 23 W.L.A. games under his belt. Brian is an excellent stickhandler, and he loves to hit.



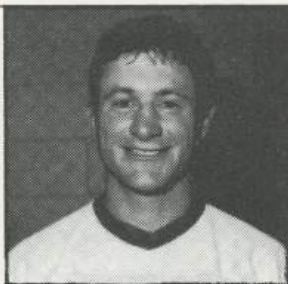
23 - Dave Stark

Several retirements have hit the Salmonbellies but general Manager Casey Cook has been hard at work to fill the holes.

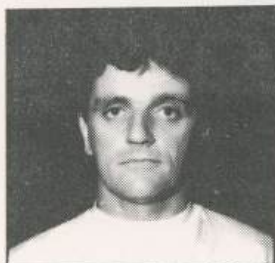

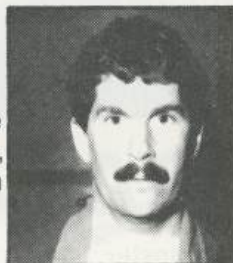
Jim Lightbody was acquired in a deal with Victoria.

After spending 15 years on the floor refining his skills of lacrosse, Steve is now going to put them to use as our Coach.



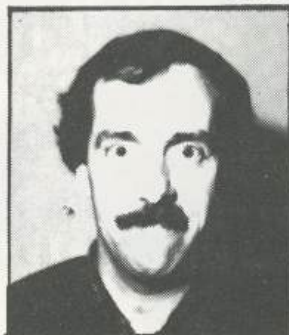

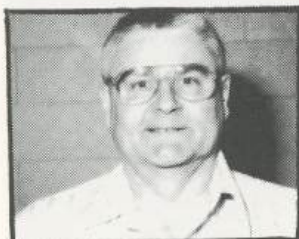

Official Signals



BUTT-ENDING

A cross motion of the referee's one: Left hand on top of right hand to form a T.



UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT PENALTY



ELBOWING

Tapping either elbow with the opposite hand.



BOARDING

Pounding the closed fist of one hand into the open palm of the other hand.



HOLDING

Clasping either wrist with the other hand well in front of the chest.



SLASHING

A series of chopping motions with the edges of one hand across the opposite forearm.



CROSS-CHECKING

A series of forward and backward motions with both fists clenched extending from the chest for a distance of about one foot.



MISCONDUCT

Placing of both hands on hips several times and pointing to penalized player.



DELAYED CALLING OF PENALTY

Referee extends arm and points once to penalized player.



INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms stationary in front of the face, fists clasped.



HIGH-STICKING

Holding both fists clenched, one immediately above the other, at the height of the forehead.



WHAP AROUND

Crossed arms stationary in front of chest.



MINOR INTERFERENCE

Forearm across chest and point in direction the team being awarded possession is attacking.



CHARGING

Rotating clenched fists around one another in front of chest.



"WASH-OUT"

Both arms swung laterally across the body with palms down; goal disallowed.



TRIPPING

Extending right leg forward, foot flat on the floor, and striking it with right hand below the knee.



HOISTING

A series of heaving motions with both arms, as if pulling something toward the stomach.

THE CANADIAN LACROSSE HALL OF FAME



CENTENNIAL COMMUNITY CENTRE

Early in 1963 a group of lacrosse enthusiasts decided that, with the historical background that New Westminster has in the National game, it would be an appropriate location for a Canadian Lacrosse Hall of Fame. With the blessings of the New Westminster City Council, the interested parties applied to the Canadian Lacrosse Association for a charter.

Their interest was rewarded after an aggressive campaign. The charter was awarded in November of 1964 and the Hall of Fame was incorporated under the Societies Act in 1965.

Selection committees were appointed in both the east and west to name the charter members. The committees met in Montreal on January 19, 1966 and 48 were initially selected. Induction of new members is made on an annual basis in three categories — Field Players, Box Players and Builders.

On May 17, 1967, Tom Gordon, then President of the Canadian Lacrosse Association, officially opened the Hall of Fame premises, located in New Westminster's Centennial Community Centre. Since the opening, a steady flow of historical and championship pictures, famous players' lacrosse sticks, sweaters, plaques, medals and trophies have been donated. In 1980, extensive alterations and additions were made to the Hall of Fame to allow for better presentation and understanding of the items on display and of Canada's National Sport.

The Board of Governors invite you to visit the Hall, and walk down memory lane with the lacrosse greats of the past.

Located in the Community Centre, the Hall of Fame is open on a fixed schedule during the summer and on a limited basis or by appointment in the winter. Group tours are welcome, but by appointment please, at all times. Admission is free.

The donation of lacrosse related material is eagerly sought, and any donations are gratefully accepted.
